#### February 11, 2019 Regular Town Meeting Minutes

Delegation Time:

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- A group of citizens led by Ms. Marsha Strong informed the council that kids walking in the road and throwing rocks at cars was beginning to be a big problem. Ms. Strong also informed the council that a pack of dogs on Watson St. was becoming a problem chasing cars, the garbage truck and harassing the home health nurse tending to Mrs. Elise Normand. Mayor Draper told the citizens that the council was voting on a new curfew ordinance and that it would be enforced for kids walking the streets at night. The Mayor also said the Town of Simmesport was looking into solutions for stray dogs.
- Cecil Whitmore brought to attention LA R.S. 38:213 which is a state law prohibiting anyone from riding vehicles of any kind on the levees. Mr. Whitmore related that he was told by a Simmesport policeman that they could not ticket people for riding on the levees unless the property owner complained. This is not the case. Mayor Draper asked Mr Whitmore if he could give his copy of the statute to the Chief of Police.

After discussion Alderman Marsh and Bell said house and signup for practices needed to be added. Alderman Marsh suggested that an adult would have to reserve the ball field. Pending these changes in the rules Alderman Coco moved to accept the rules for use of the ball field. Alderman Marsh second the motion. All present voted as follows:

Engineer Jeremy Hebron told the mayor that Meyer & Meyer Engineering firm was working on a needs assessment for the Town and still pursuing the USDA Grants. He also stated that the LCDBG grants were due at the end of June and they would like to begin working on them now. Hebron stated that the LCBDG grants have not been awarding grants for infrastructure such as roads but have been awards to mostly awarded to water and sewer projects.

Fire Chief Dana Smith told the council that the town had no fires in the month of January and the number of emergency calls had decreased.

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Chief Damion Jacobs gave his monthly report for service calls and arrests. He also told the council that he would increase patrols in town to thwart the gangs of young people roaming the streets. Chief Jacobs also asked the community present to please call the police department (*during working hours 318-941-2576 or after hours 318-253-4000*).

Alderman Turner said he had no complaints.

Alderman Marsh of District 2 also said he had no complaints.

Alderman Brown asked that the workers continue to fill potholes.

Alderman Coco asked about drainage and how efforts to increase drainage were coming along.

Alderman Bell only said we needed to keep filling potholes.
